Meaning

The Good News:

God has revealed his character in his moral commands, which are given so we can achieve true human flourishing.

Deliverance

What's the way out of life's problems?

People know that the world isn't as it should be. They often look to entertainment and/or various addictions for a momentary sense of deliverance.

The Good News:

We need to to be delivered from sin and guilt. God can redeem us and someday he will restore all creation. Inside, everyone longs for that redemption.

Destiny
